This might be the case also with other I.I. members. We might not be able to pass on the tradition of ikebana even to our daughters and sons even as I cannot. Therefore it is ironic that I am writing the president's message to promote ikebana to more than 7000 I.I. members all over the world!

Because of aging membership, the continued decrease in worldwide I.I. membership is our biggest concern, and no one disputes this. It is our great desire to encourage more and more young people to become active participants. We definitely have to work hard to sow the seeds of ikebana to grow around the world for the young generation.

I am going to do my best, and I want to thank all of the members for giving me this wonderful opportunity and look forward to serving as International President.

Business plan for 2019-2020

1. Face-to-face communication – "Let's Meet Up"

In this business year, the 18th North and Central American Regional Conference will be held from 27th to 31st October 2019 in Dallas/Fort Worth, Texas, in the US.

Hyderabad Chapter in India will host the 15th Asian Regional Conference on 16th -19th November 2020.

Also, the next World Convention will be held in Tokyo in 2022.

Under our motto Friendship through Flowers, at these ikebana conferences, we enjoy and enrich our life through ikebana and flowers by meeting up face-to-face.

However, we live in a digital society. Even without the benefit of membership in Ikebana International, individuals can fulfill our Friendship through Flowers instantly by uploading some photos of his/her own ikebana artworks. People can achieve Friendship through Flowers by themselves without I.I. This urges us in I.I. to reconsider the different ways to increase membership, I think.

Even if I.I. chapters' websites are brilliant, and even if the digital network among chapter members is well organized, these might not be enough, even though they are necessary.

Attractive gatherings would also bring our new members to I.I. chapters, I believe.

Face-to-face communication should be emphasized more or be paid attention to.

I would like to suggest that each chapter make continuous efforts to give more chances to their members to get together and have fun. This year I would like to encourage each chapter to give more chances for their members to meet up.

This is the first message I would like to convey to all of you as a business plan 2019-2020.

2. Membership.

To address the continued decrease in worldwide membership, we at Headquarters will analyze statistically the reason for that. Breakdown by regions, age, ikebana schools, and by duration of membership will help us make a more logical analysis in detail.

3. Publication

Sakura News, Chapter Activities, and I.I. Magazine which are published three times a year, are the main benefits which members can receive from our Headquarters.

We will not downgrade its quality; I would like to emphasize it.

In fact, since last December, the office staff position of "Publication Manager" has been vacant, because the manager left our office last year. Thus, I have a plan to hire a new publication manager and enhance our publication quality to satisfy our members all over the world.

4. New Year Luncheon

We will hold a New Year Luncheon on 27th January in 2020. Princess Takamado will honor us with her presence, and Mr. Hiroki Ohara, Headmaster of Ohara School, will demonstrate ikebana artworks at this luncheon. This time we have already sent our invitation letters to not only domestic chapters but also all overseas chapters.

We will open our doors to every member in the world to invite them to our New Year Luncheon to implement face-to-face communication with many I.I. members abroad.

5. Website

Communication through the Internet cannot be disregarded. We will enhance our Headquarters' website and try hard to keep Ikebana International members and friends well informed. We will recreate our website and try to promote I.I. to the world.

6. Ikebana Grand Prix

Every year Headquarters is asked to support the Ikebana Grand Prix by awarding prizes to the exhibition winners. This ikebana exhibition and competition is to be held on 23rd November 2019, and the prize ceremony will be on 11th January 2020.

Annual General Meeting of Ikebana International was opened by Acting International President Miho Okawara. Acting International President Miho Okawara called Annual General Meeting to order at 10:30 am.

Recording Secretary Junko Nakajima reported the total number of attendees including received proxies. Total attendees were 692.

1. Business Report for 2018-2019

Acting International President Miho Okawara presented the 2018-2019 Business Report.

2. Financial Report for 2018-2019

Treasurer Rieko Kawamura made the report on financial statement for 2018-2019 business year, which was audited by Accounting Auditor of Ikebana International.

3. Announcement of candidates

Nominating Director Nobuko Matsubara announced the candidates' names of 19 Board Directors and 1 Auditor and 1 Accounting Auditor.

4. Election of nineteen (19) Directors of the International Board

Election took place for each candidate by raising hand. Tellers Kazuko Yano and Yumie Sasaki counted the voting numbers.

Acting International President announced that the 19 elected Board Directors for 2019-2020 were approved by a majority of affirmative votes. All elected Board Directors accepted to assume office.

5. Election of one Auditor and one Accounting Auditor

Auditor Yoshimasa Usui (2019-2021) and Accounting Auditor Mikio Koyano (2019-2020) were approved by a majority of affirmative votes. They accepted to assume the office.

6. Annual General Meeting Recess

The Annual General Meeting went recess. New Board of Directors left the room to hold the first Board of Directors Meeting.

The Oedo Cultural Art Festival 2019 was held at the Hamarikyu Garden in Tokyo on August 23, 24 and 25. The world-famous fashion designer Junko Koshino assumed the role of general producer for the entire event. Various events were arranged for visitors to enjoy Japanese culture in the garden with the support of the Agency for Cultural Affairs and Chuo Ward Office.

Ikebana International used the falconer's house called "Taka no Ochaya" to display the board members' ikebana arrangements of six schools as well as two fantastic works by Junko Koshino. And in the garden, a contemporary work of driftwood was boldly displayed outside of the falconer's house.

There were performances of several Japanese martial arts and Japanese comic story telling (rakugo) on the ship departing from the park. A wide range of performances including Japanese traditional music (hougaku) and tea ceremony were given.

The ikebana exhibition showing the sophisticated culture in Edo period was well accepted by the visitors. They seemed to be impressed that I.I. consists of various different ikebana schools. It was a wonderful opportunity to introduce Ikebana International to the visitors.

In Memoriam: Allie Uyehara

Stephanie Tomiyasu, Past International President

Allie Uyehara was an original member of Ikebana International, having attended Ellen Gordon Allen's founding meeting at International House in Tokyo in 1956. Allie was a strong advocate for the art of ikebana and a devoted member of I.I. With her warm and cheerful personality, she was a powerful force for I.I. wherever she lived.

Allie grew up in a small Montana town, Chinook, a town that now has a population of around a thousand. She met her husband Cecil when they were students at the University of Minnesota. After they moved to Japan in 1955, she began to study ikebana, earning teaching certificates in both the Sogetsu and Saga Goryu Schools.

Allie founded three chapters of Ikebana International: Chinook #8, Boston #17, and Dayton (Ohio) #33. She served on the Board of Directors of Washington, DC, Chapter #1 from 1972 to 2014. She even taught ikebana in Kabul, Afghanistan, when Cecil's work took them there.

Allie made many trips back to Chinook to hold ikebana workshops. This chapter, in a rural part of a mainly rural state, continued to be active until Allie's final illness prevented her from travelling. Allie died on February 5, 2019, at 92.
